Dear Parents,

We are excited that your child will be joining us at Glenwood Landing School. In order to be sure the transition is a smooth one, you and your child are invited to participate in a variety of activities designed to help you become familiar with the faculty and the building. Please review the list of upcoming kindergarten orientation activities below.

FIRST STEP - PLEASE CALL THE MAIN OFFICE (516) 277-2601 TO SCHEDULE APPOINTMENT FOR BUILDING REGISTRATION/STUDENT SCREENING.

- 1. BUILDING LEVEL REGISTRATION AND STUDENT SCREENING will take place March 19-22 and will take approximately 60 minutes. Parent and child will be required to attend.**
Parent will meet with Yvette D'Amico, Secretary and Ms. Schmiemann, Nurse to complete paperwork and collect important information about your child. Please bring to this appointment the completed and approved District Residency Packet from your visit with Ms. Katherine Miller, District Registrar. Your child will participate in a series of mini-assessments to evaluate basic readiness skills. Please report to the main hallway at your scheduled time and your child will be escorted to the screening area. While a brief explanation of the mini-assessments will be available for you, results of screening will only be shared if our team has concerns.
- 2. CLASSROOM VISIT I-(Orientation Day) MONDAY, APRIL 23, 2017 (Required for child and parent, appointment time will be assigned to you, 90 minutes)**
Your child will participate in typical kindergarten activities. While your child is enjoying this experience, you will learn more about our school, what to expect in kindergarten and how to prepare your child through an informational session with the principal and support staff.
- 3. CLASSROOM VISIT II-(Shadowing Day) MONDAY, MAY 14, 2017, 1:00-2:00 pm. (Required for child only, parents optional)**
Students will participate in typical Kindergarten activities with other incoming students. Parents are invited to meet with the School Community Association (parent group) in the library to find out how to get involved in our community and learn more about the extracurricular activities we offer.
